# Living Christianly

This term, we will be focussing on **Christ-Like**.

Wk 7 Concept: The Restorative Process (Perspective)

Restoration: We need to do what is needed to make things right in a relationship (Zaccheus gave back what he had stolen from others)

**Memory Verse:** Jesus said, "Salvation has come to this house today.... The Son of Man came to find lost people and save them." **Luke 19: 9-10** 

Wk 8 Concept: The Easter Story (Jesus's death and resurrection is the ultimate restorative act) Jesus presses on towards Jerusalem (even though He knew He was going to His death)

**Memory Verse:** Then Jesus went into Jerusalem. The city was filled with excitement. The people asked, "Who is this man?" **Matthew 21:10 (ICB)** 

## Better Basics - Spelling

This year, Te Kākano is putting an emphasis on ensuring that our children find success in literacy and numeracy. As part of this we have initiated a spelling programme. Children will bring home the same spelling words for two weeks. We will test these twice, to ensure that they are secure. Please teach these to your children at home both verbally and in writing. The more words children know how to write, generally the better quality writing is produced.

#### Ways to teach spelling at home:

#### 1. Teach your child spelling words with 'Lily Pad Letters'

Take a large sheet of construction paper and write each of the letters of the alphabet. Cut the area around each letter into the shape of a lily pad and lay them out on the floor. You can even ask your child to help you decorate the lily pads and colour them green.

Have two of your children pair up to play this game, or team up with your child yourself. To play, the first person must think of a word and read it aloud. The second must then step on the letters to spell the word.

#### 2. Use 'Stair Steps' to memorise certain words

This is an easy game to help your child memorise the way certain words are spelled. Have your child write each word as if they are stairs, adding one letter at a time. For example: S/Sp/Spe/Spel/Spell

#### 3. Toss around the 'Spelling Ball'

Here's a fun game that the whole family can enjoy. Stand together in a circle with a ball. Call out a word, toss the ball to another person, and have that person spell out the word, and so on. If the word isn't spelled correctly, then whoever has the ball tosses it to another person who will try to spell it.

#### 4. Use magazine clippings to familiarise with letters

Have your child cut out the letters from a newspaper or magazine to spell words. This will encourage them to consider each letter carefully and individually, while creating visual representations of the words as a helpful memory aid.

#### 5. Play 'Scrambled Spelling' using alphabet blocks or fridge magnets

Give your child a number of scrambled words. You can use alphabet blocks or fridge magnets, or even make your own by writing letters on pieces of paper. Then haven them unscramble the words within a time limit. This game makes a great competition for multiple children.

#### 6. Create a 'Spelling Train' to have fun while spelling words

Read a word aloud and have your child write it down. Using the last letter in that word, ask them to write another word beginning with that last letter. They can continue the 'spelling train' using the last letter of the word. For example:

Toe, Eat, Tea, Ant, Tin

#### 7. Play online spelling games for kids

Online spelling games designed for kids is a great way to teach your child spelling words and skills in a fun, low-pressure, and highly effective way.





We are really proud of some of the children who are reading everyday. Teachers are keeping record of how many nights our reading children are reading at home and some children are fast approaching our first mile'stone' of 25 nights.
