Play-based Learning

Over the next few newsletters we are going to be looking at schemas and the role they play in your child's play. Schemas are the avenues children explore to make sense of the world. Schemas in children's play are such an important concept when it comes to the development of children, that it's worth taking the time to understand them so you can facilitate them when you see them at home and we can support them at school.



## This week's schema is: Enveloping

To have a sheet over your head, wrapping things in fabrics or with tape and paper - all actions seen in the Enveloping schema. An extension of this is peek-a-boo, now you see it now you don't, a concept that just keeps on amusing. Children may be interested in enveloping themselves, objects or space, e.g. wrapping themselves in blankets or curtains! They may enjoy making parcels and putting everyday objects inside.



At school, the Te Kākano children love to get into any cardboard box that will fit them and enjoy hiding in our puppet theatre and plastic house. We often find the children making huts and getting in there. We will happily take any donations of envelopes (including used) and paper, also any blankets or tarps would be so appreciated.



At home, to support this schema, Provide blankets and fabrics so your children can wrap themselves, their teddies or toys. If they enjoy enveloping objects, they may like to use old envelopes or make parcels out of yesterday's newspaper.

This term, we will be focussing on **Excellence - Character**.



RCS Values Competency-Based Learning

This week, we would like to share a STEM learning activity that our Towards Te Pihinga children did with with Mr Smith last Friday. We are wanting to really focus on giving our children the opportunity to extend their thinking and be challenged in their creativity.

The challenge was for them to make a conveyor belt out of recycled materials. While doing this they demonstrated the RCS 'Creative' value at the 'Pre-Foundation' Level:

- **Asking the right inquiry questions** (I am learning how to ask questions about a topic that interests me.)
- **Developing new ideas and solutions** (When I face a challenge I come up with one idea to solve it.)
- **Leadership for action** (I can complete a task with another person.)
