Mathematics: (from the NZmaths site)

You probably know that the New Zealand Curriculum guides your child's teachers in planning the mathematics that your child learns in the classroom. So when you've visited our classrooms, you will have seen that there is much more to maths than just remembering times tables and doing sums.

While these are still very important, your child also needs to be able to see patterns, to locate themselves and find their way, to know about the shapes that make up the spaces around them, to measure things, to tell the time, and to understand graphs, facts and figures that are so much a part of our world.

Above all, they need to be able to use the maths they know in everyday situations. That's why your support is important and appreciated.

Reading: Do you still read to your children? The benefits of reading out loud to your child are still very relevant at this age and although life can be busy with sports and other outside interests there are still huge benefits to reading aloud at any age. Here are a few:

- It helps to create a life time interest in reading

- It helps language development and vocabulary which in turn fosters fluency in their own reading as you model it
- As you read aloud, the power of your child's imagination grows stronger
- It helps build comprehension
- It's a great way to continue developing a bond with your child






Reminders


