Circle Time

For Circle Time this term we have had a big focus on Managing Emotions. We have looked at awesome topics such as; managing and exploring worries, escalating emotions, deep/diaphragmatic breathing, reacting to big emotions, and building positive friendships. Circle Time is an opportunity once a week to work on building up a bank of social/emotional skills. Our goal is to equip all our children with skills and knowledge in their 'tool belt' so that as they grow and develop, they will always have a belt filled with helpful tools to use. I feel blessed that our Circle Time lessons help the children grow in their emotional intelligence while at school. Some of my favourite things to teach have been looking at the proper technique for belly breathing as well as considering worry versus reality. Through a series of questions, the children were encouraged to explore the most likely outcomes for their worried-about situation, rather than the worst imaginable outcomes.

Better basics.....

Uniform: Wear the correct uniform all the time. Hat must also be school hats.
