We have all TP tamariki back to school now and it has been lovely to welcome them back in the 'new' normal. They have all coped admirably with the changes and restrictions under level 2. I have noticed a couple of stifled yawns in the last day or two, so perhaps Queen's birthday weekend will be a welcome break to get some extra rest.

#### Level 2 rules at school:

#### Home time:

We will continue to stagger finishing times and the Te Pihinga children are out on the basketball court by 2:50pm. They wait there until we see you arrive at the gate. If you come in the gate you must sign in. We are happy to send the children to the gate as soon as you arrive.

#### What's happening in class:

TP have got straight back to learning with minimal change. The biggest difference was that the children mostly stayed with their own kōhanga teacher for writing, maths and LIGHTS which we usually mix up between two teachers. The exception was reading where the children were taught by their reading teacher in small groups.

**Next week:** We will go back to the children exchanging teachers for reading, writing and maths as per last term. There have been a few changes in reading groups and Miss Horn is joining us to take some children for reading, writing and maths so that we have smaller groups and more opportunity to keep the focus on these essential areas of the curriculum. Thank you Miss Horn for your help!

**LIGHTS:** As LIGHTS was interrupted last term, since being back at school, the focus has been more on our current situation and completing mini projects. This has been good for TP students to get familiar with the LIGHTS cycle by moving through the levels more quickly. We have introduced De Bono's six thinking hats to the children as a thinking strategy to use when investigating the alternatives of the problems we could see in our current situation (Level 2 lockdown at school).


For example the children discussed what the problems were in level 2; e.g. not being able to play games that involve touching or getting too close to one another. They are now investigating alternative games and will come up with a mini project based on teaching a new game they have made up to other students to play.
