This is a great honour and testament to the hard work that has been put in by the Te Kākano teachers over the past year. It has been a huge investment to get Learning Through Play into RCS. The teachers have watched and won multiple Trade Me auctions, scoured Facebook Marketplace, gone to markets in the rain, spent Saturdays at Play-based professional development, done online courses, visited other schools and preschools, edited and re-edited the timetable, had numerous conversations with other plau-based educators, talked to you as parents, learned how to use Seesaw, been granted funds from the BOT, asked the PCG to fundraise for a flexible playaround, and brought in our own toys from home. The investment has and will continue to pay off because of your wonderful children. We can set everything up as best as we can but it's all just stuff until your children add their imaginations, creative-thinking, problem-solving and social skills. Seesaw paints a wonderful picture of how rich our small investment has really made the learning in Te Kākano and as a side benefit we are now 'leaders' in play-based pedagogy in Christian Schools. Kendra's workshop is entitled 'Learning Through Play in a Christian Context'. It will be about our journey in implementing Learning Through Play with our Year 1-3 hub at Rolleston Christian School.
