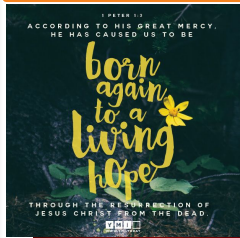

Concerns at School

Time to time, you may have a concern that comes up for your children and/or your whānau. We thought we would take the opportunity now to remind you how our school structure works for concerns and who to see about what.

<p>Kōhanga Teachers Kendra Ficks Gabby Nuthall Mark Smith Emily Langridge</p>	<p>Anything to do with your child's health needs, friendship issues, concerns about reading/writing/math, in class behaviour of your child or another child, Collaborative Actions Plans, things your child may have said at home that have worried you or anything that involves pastoral care support.</p>
<p>Team Leader Kendra</p>	<p>Wider curriculum concerns, Level 2 behaviours, further clarification after a conversation with a kōhanga teacher, bullying, lack of academic progress over time, elevating friendship issues and any hub wide decisions/queries.</p>
<p>Principal Liz</p>	<p>Level 3 behaviours or laying a formal complaint about a situation that you feel has not be addressed appropriately by the kōhanga teachers or team leader.</p>

If you feel it is not a 'quick' conversation or you'd like to sit down with the staff member involved, please email us with a brief outline of what your concern is about and a day/time that suits you. We will endeavour to get back to you as soon as possible with a time to meet. There is more information about formal complaints in the School & Whānau Partnership Handbook on the RCS website under the 'Parent Information' tab.

Side note: End of term time for juniors can become more challenging as they become more weary, and we do expect the odd incident to occur. Please speak to your child's kōhanga teacher directly if anything happens over the next couple of weeks.
