Working with each other as a team (working independently as a team)

This means we need to talk, listen and contribute to each person growing in Christ through love and working together as a team with each person playing a part according to their strengths.

Interpersonal and team-related skills

Christians are called to value and love one another, acknowledging that everyone can contribute and be heard. We bring Glory to God when we work together esteeming each other, and showing fruits of the Spirit. We celebrate our growth.

Social, emotional and intercultural skills

God has made us all different and we need to respect and value our uniqueness and the uniqueness of others. Christians seek to have a good understanding of who they are in God, therefore they can form positive relationships with others and grow in social and emotional maturity.

Understanding my team and solving problems (Managing team dynamics and challenges)
