The children have also been busu learning some new literacy and numeracy games.





Play-based Learning

Over the next few newsletters we are going to be looking at schemas and the role they play in your child's play. Schemas are the avenues children explore to make sense of the world. Schemas in children's play are such an important concept when it comes to the development of children, that it's worth taking the time to understand them so you can facilitate them when you see them at home and we can support them at school.

#### This week's schema is: Connection

Do you like completing puzzles, doing adult dot-to-dots, or making crafts like crochet and knitting? Do you do find satisfaction in stapling or clipping things together, using pegs to hang up your washing or tying up plants to their stake? These are all examples of the **connection** schema.

Joining train tracks, clicking together pieces of lego, running a string from one thing to another... this is the urge of **connection**. This can mean connecting *and* disconnecting too, building followed by destruction, and that can mean other people's buildings and sandcastles get destructed when the urge gets hold.

At home, to support this schema play, offer construction toys, trains and track pieces and any other toy that connects with magnets or Velcro. Your child will cherish string, ribbon, chains, tape or any materials that can bind things together. Containers with lids will be a huge hit as will elastics stretched across nails pounded into pieces of wood.









# Living Christianly

This term, we will be focussing on Hope - Citizenship. At the moment we are focussing on Genuine interest in human and environmental sustainability.
