# Welcome to Week 5/6 of Term 1!

We are now into the everyday routines of school life and the honeymoon is over! Learning is into full swing and literacy assessment will take place in Week 6 & 7. As the children tire a little, sometimes relationships begin to become a little frazzled. This is when our school values can really be put into practice and "lived out" and every morning in Hui time we are discussing how this can happen. Our whakatauki for the last few weeks has been "He waka eke noa" - "We are all in this together!" So, let's look out for each other.

## L.I.G.H.T.S (our action based inquiry learning)

This week the two classes rotate to the other teacher - Totara will be learning important events after the treaty with Mrs Cleave, and Rātā important events & people before the Treaty of Waitangi with Mrs Manson. Although we are still in the "L", already the children have identified problems such as misunderstanding, mistrust, lying, not knowing each other's culture. We are getting excited about how we can turn these into solutions!

## Reading at Home

A reminder that all children are expected to read for 20 minutes at home. It may be a book of their choice. We highly recommend a visit to the Selwyn Library to help broaden the variety/genre of the books your child reads.
