"In conclusion it depends on who you are. Do you care about your reputation and values, and have you thought about how your actions could affect someone?"






Te Mahuri is going to the Science Roadshow!

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Conceptual understanding is students being able to transfer their mathematical knowledge into new situations and apply it to new contexts. Adding context builds in skills of analysing and evaluating, and having the chance to creative and curious with their knowledge.
