Curriculum focus

Reading: Our TP children in general love reading. We have silent reading, guided reading in groups and independent reading activities everyday. Fostering a love of reading is really important at this stage as they begin to develop the skills to learn to read for meaning and information. Below is a snippet that sums up what most children in Te Pihinga will need to become successful readers:

Adequate progress in learning to read English (or any alphabetic language) beyond the initial level depends on:

- having a working understanding of how sounds are represented alphabetically
- sufficient practice in reading to achieve fluency with different kinds of texts
- sufficient background knowledge and vocabulary to render written texts meaningful and interesting
- control over procedures for monitoring comprehension and repairing misunderstandings
- continued interest and motivation to read for a variety of purposes

Living Christianly: This term we begin with the story of Genesis. Our theme is 'the earth sustains the life'. It is God's creation and He has commissioned us to be his stewards (kaitiakitanga) of it. "Our goal is to work together with God for the renewal of all things....to run it on his behalf" until our hope is fulfilled.




Reminders
